Your Corpus Christi Safety & Security Team is offering the parish community a new education course to teach evidence-based, life-saving bleeding control techniques which have been shown to dramatically increase survival in emergency situations. The course is presented by the ICSave program in conjunction with our Diocesan office and teaches life-saving medical interventions, including bleeding control with a tourniquet, bleeding control with gauze packs, and opening an airway to allow a casualty to breathe. The course is designed for folks who could benefit from this basic knowledge. It will be held here on Saturday morning, May 12, in two different sessions from 9–11:30 and 1–3:30. 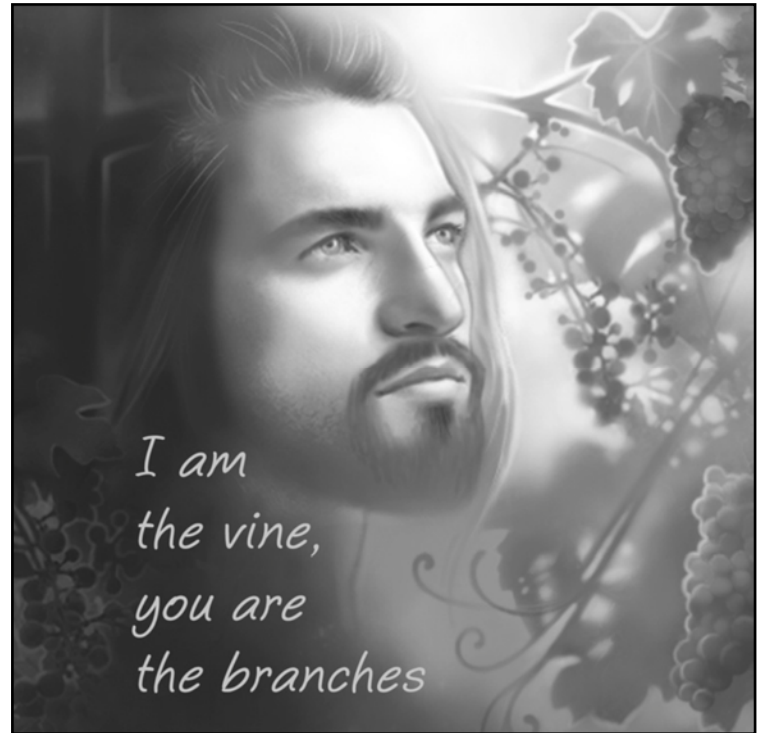
Corpus Christi Building Mortgage Loan Update

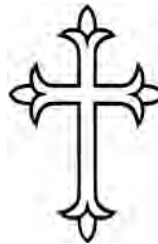
