Can an impetuous Jewish fisherman from rural Galilee find common ground with a squared away, Gentile, master sergeant? This has the makings of a great sit-com! Peter and Cornelius – The Odd Couple! We catch the tail end of a conversion story, not just Peter's, but the entire Christian community. Peter has grown up immersed in Judaism. Even his time with Jesus and post-resurrection ministry has been focused within Judaism. It shapes who he is and how he views the world. His opening line to Cornelius is "You know that it is unlawful for a Jewish man to associate with, or visit, a Gentile." And then the Spirit shatters his world view and all his life-long cultural boundaries. The Spirit falls upon these Gentiles! Peter might think that it is impossible and could never happen. He could feel they don't deserve it. He might be annoyed with God for changing the rules in the middle of the game. "How do you expect me to be good when you keep pulling the rug out from under me?" He could and he might, but he doesn't. Rather... "He ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ." May we all have the virtue of Peter.

Your Corpus Christi Safety & Security Team is offering the parish community a new education course to teach evidence-based, life-saving bleeding control techniques which have been shown to dramatically increase survival in emergency situations. The course is presented by the ICSave program in conjunction with our Diocesan office and teaches life-saving medical interventions, including bleeding control with a tourniquet, bleeding control with gauze packs, and opening an airway to allow a casualty to breathe. The course is designed for folks who could benefit from this basic knowledge. It will be held here on Saturday morning, May 12, in two different sessions from 9–11:30 and 1–3:30. MARY, QUEEN OF ANGELS

May is the month set aside in the church to pay particular reverence to Mary. This is the first in a series of articles about the Blessed Mother's various titles.

When Mary is seated beside her Divine Son, it is the angels who are often envisioned placing a crown upon her head. This name is also tied to the Assumption of Mary into Heaven, and described in Revelation as a "woman clothed with the sun, on the head, a crown of twelve stars." (Rev.12:1) As a reward for her holiness and perfection of virtues, she has dominion over the Angels and Saints as their queen. The sweetness of her manner endears her to the everlasting kingdom of love. The angels bow low before her, as the Angel Gabriel did at Nazareth. It is a privilege for them to minister to her. They recognize her bright spirit as full of grace and they are thrilled with delight as forever they proclaim her "blessed among women." She is a prodigy of divine wisdom and omnipotence, the "crown of all the saints."

Feb 1. Monthly Loan Payment: \$ 21,000
(\$13,600 principal; \$7,740 interest)
