So, you want to be a prophet? Jeremiah gives us a pretty good job description of what that means – rejection, persecution, and martyrdom. I'm not sure if Paul was conscious of it, but he seems to conform himself to the mold of Jeremiah. His mission of proclaiming the Good News is fraught with peril – rejection, persecution, and maybe even death. Why would anyone even start an endeavor with such an ending? Jeremiah explains why in the verses just preceding where he is wrestling with the Lord (which we will encounter in about two months; how's that for continuity problems?). To paraphrase, "I can't help myself. I don't want to, but every fiber of my being compels me to be the Lord's prophet!" I'd guess most of us aren't there yet; certainly, I'm not. For those that are, be patient with the rest of us. Our prayer is that day by day we make progress as disciples, even if the progress is only baby steps!
