#### Heart Disease Symptoms in Women

- Pain in upper back, jaw or neck
- Shortness of breath
- Flu-like symptoms: nausea or vomiting, cold sweats
- Fatigue or weakness
- Feelings of anxiety, loss of appetite, discomfort

#### **Heart Attack Warning Signs**

- Pressure, burning, squeezing in the center of the chest
- Discomfort in one or both arms, shoulders, neck, jaw, stomach or back
- Shortness of breath
- Fatigue, cold sweat, nausea, weakness
