#### Honoring Mary in May Santa Maria Maggiore

#### Last Week: the Basilica; This Week: the Saint



Gregory the Great may have been inspired by Byzantine devotions to Mary when becoming Pope during a plague in 590 that took the life of the previous pope. Mary had been named the Theotokos, Mother of God, at the Council of Ephesus in 431. This most important Marian icon, traditionally believed to be created by St.

Luke the Evangelist, patron saint of painters, on a plank of cedar wood, is displayed in the Pauline Chapel of St. Mary Major. The iconic painting was paraded through the streets of Rome for three days during a 6th-century plague and Pope Gregory I paused to pray in front of it to implore for an end to the plague. The icon's title is Santa Maria Maggiore, Salus Populi Romani, translated "Health of the Roman People" and further holding the Blessed Virgin as "Protectoress of the Roman People." She is credited with saving Rome from the plague along with many other miracles, including protecting Rome from invasion by the Nazis in WWII.

As stated in last week's reflection, Pope Francis prayed before the image before/after his apostolic journeys, a Jesuit tradition. Since its beginning the Society of Jesus has fostered devotion to this icon by distributing copies of it throughout the world.

Another fact of interest: This icon has also been known as Our Lady of the Snows reflective of her sign to build a church where it snowed in August in Rome. (See last week's article.) There is an image in the church revered as Our Lady of the Snows, believed to have been produced by St. Luke as well.

The icon was cleaned and restored carefully in 2018.

St. Andrew's Concert Series presents Jeffery Campbell, organist in a program of music by J.S. Bach, Louis Vierne, Whitlock and Susato on Friday, May 16, 2025 at 7:00pm. Jeffery Campbell is the Associate Music Director and Principal Organist of Saint Philip's in the Hills Episcopal Church in Tucson. The organ was built by the M.P.
