

Mass Intentions

The custom of requesting a priest to offer the Mass for a specific intention, even when one cannot be physically present at the Mass, is a longstanding tradition in the Church. An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday or anniversary), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died. Mass Intentions at Corpus Christi are scheduled Monday-Friday, 8:00am daily Mass. Honoring Mary in May Our Lady of Hope

This year has been declared as the Jubilee of Hope, reflecting on the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite not knowing. When we are discouraged and pessimistic, God's word helps us find reason for hope.


On January 17, 1871, the Virgin Mary appeared to 6 children, not visible to adults, in Pontmain, France, during the Franco-Prussian War. She encouraged prayer and hope as the war approached their town, assuring them that the conflict would end soon. Her message in this apparition was, "But pray, my children. God will hear you in a short time. My Son allows Himself to be moved with compassion." While the apparition was happening, the campaign was halted and 10 days later an armistice was signed.

Our Lady wore a dark blue dress, covered with gold stars, a black veil, and a simple gold crown. Later that evening as the community sang and prayed, two white crosses shone on her shoulders. She lowered her hands and a white veil covered her. And then she disappeared. The scare was over. When we seek the maternal care of our Blessed Mother, we remember she stood at the foot of the cross with hope of the forgiveness of sin and resurrection to everlasting life. This brings us hope in our journey, never abandoned.


