
The Mission of Corpus Christi





Today Peter proclaims to the Sanhedrin, "We are witnesses of these things!" That word, "witness", is an essential element of discipleship for Luke as we follow first Peter and then Paul through Acts. It comes from the Greek "martureis", to witness, testify, or attest, and it's easy to see our English word, Martyr. Odds are no one here will be called to give their lives, to be a Martyr for our faith in any grand situation or event. But there are lots of small and ordinary opportunities to exercise discipleship – in the checkout line, in traffic, around the watercooler, or on the playground. In every moment and interaction, our words, actions, and presence are opportunities to bear witness and provide testimony to Christ Jesus.

Honoring Mary in May <u>Papal Basilica of St. Mary Major</u> *Church of Santa Maria Maggiore*



Three miles from St. Peter's, the Basilica of St. Mary Major is one of 4 papal basilicas as well as one of 7 Pilgrim Churches of Rome. It is the first Marian sanctuary in the Western World, the place where Pope Francis praved

before/after his apostolic journeys and more than 100 times in his papacy. It is the place of his entombment in the corridor outside of the Pauline Chapel which enshrines the icon of *Santa Maria, Salus Populus Romani* to whom he prayed.

Also known as Our Lady of the Snows, legend has it that the Virgin Mary asked for a church to be built in her honor and the sign she gave was on August 5th, though summer, when snow fell on the summit of the Esquiline Hill (one of Rome's 7 hills) and a church in her honor was built there. This miracle is commemorated each year when white rose petals are dropped from its dome during the feast day mass.

Over time St. Mary Major was also known as St. Mary of the Crib because 5 sycamore boards thought to have been from the manger of Christ's birth are the relics housed under the papal altar in this building. The first Christmas midnight mass was celebrated here.

A church is named a basilica by apostolic grant and this one is one of only 4 named as a "*major* basilica." Pope Benedict named 5 as *papal* basilicas and they, along with 2 others, are known as the 7 Pilgrim Churches of Rome. There are now 8 popes buried here and the mortal remains of St. Matthew are also within this basilica.




